

Protecting Payment Card Information





Protecting your employees from the dangers of bloodborne pathogens is critical. This course addresses common hazards, personal protective equipment (PPE), and proper cleanup procedures.





Using a social networking theme and reality-based stories, this course guides students on methods to recognize and address harassing behavior, whether it's targeted at them or another person.






Student Mental Health Collection






Sexual Assault and Misconduct

Title IX Collection

This course collection was developed to help institutions meet training obligations under Title IX and the Violence Against Women Act (VAWA) and is meant to complement other prevention efforts at your institution.

In June 2022, the U.S. Department of Education (ED) released proposed regulations related to Title IX that will govern how educational institutions conduct inquiries into allegations of sex discrimination, including student sexual misconduct. Once they are final, our courses will be updated to reflect the new regulations.








Mosaic: Prevent Discrimination and Harassment Together


